## MATHCOUNTS COMPETITION

Congratulations to the 7th \& 8th Grade Mathletes!! Some of the 7th \& 8th grade students participated in two math competitions this year; MathCounts \& ICTM (Illinois Council of Teachers of Mathematics Organization). MathCounts is a national competition and ICTM is a statewide competition.

## MathCounts

The MathCounts program provides engaging math problems to 5th through 8th grade students of all ability levels to build confidence and improve attitudes about math and problem solving. There are other opportunities to practice and participate in a variety of activities all year round to promote more interest in mathematics and engineering.

The school competition determines which students qualify for the chapter competition. We had a team of 4 students who also participated in the individual competition. There were 10 students, in total, who participated in the Chapter contest. The team that earns 1st place position as a team and the top 2 students in the individual portion of the Chapter competition qualify for the State contest.

## Workbooks

Summer Bridge
These books have been highly recommended by teachers and parents for quite some time. Some workbooks cover just one subject area, where others encompass math, reading, social studies, science, and physical education. They are usually grouped by grade level and broken down into a daily lesson for each week of the summer. The Teacher's Aide in Moline and Davenport always carry these. They can also be found online.

## Scholastic Weekly Reader SUmmer Express

These workbooks are for Pk-5th grades. Each book focuses on reading, writing, and math for 10 weeks. These can be found on Amazon and the Scholastic website.

## Summer Fit

These books are available for grades PK-8. The curriculum covers reading, writing, math, language arts, science, and geography. A daily fitness $\log$ is also included to encourage kids to get moving. The program also addresses Christian core values. They are available on Amazon.
